CRITERIA	SCORE
<b>1. Format (maximum score 5)</b> The format consists of: a planned research title (in Indonesian and English), approval from the academic advisor and promoters 1, 2, and 3, a summary of the research plan, the background of the study, research problems, research objectives, hypotheses, benefits, and a list of reference.	
<b>2. Title, summary, and keywords (maximum score 5)</b> The title should not exceed 20 words in Indonesian and 10-20 words in English, communicative, easy to be understood, suitable with the student's field of study, and reflects the depth of the planned research. There is a connection between the title and the background of the study. The summary elaborates the scientific gap, research problems and future research in 600-800 words, written in Indonesian and English.	
<b>3. Background of the problem (maximum score 35)</b> It contains the scope of the problem, pathophysiology or root of the problem by showing all variables related to the research plan and problem-solving or solutions offered. The sentences explain the latest developments of the topic. There are opportunities to generate new ideas. At the end of the background emerges the purpose and novelty of the research. It must use good and correct Indonesian (not a translation). It must present correct paragraphs and common threads between paragraphs	
<b>4. Research problems (maximum score 10)</b> It consists of general and specific problems. The general problem is a global research question, and the specific problem is a more detailed description of the question containing all the variables.	
<b>5. Research objectives (maximum score 15)</b> It consists of general and specific purposes. General objectives reflect global efforts to address common problems. Specific objectives reflect painstaking efforts to answer specific problems. The stages clearly state the relationship between variables in a measurable way.	
<b>6. Research benefits (maximum score 5)</b> It contains academic and practical benefits in line with the development of the scientific field.	
<b>7. Reference (maximum score 5)</b> The student must present correct reference writing. The reference must be relevant. The reference must use recent journals as its source with 90% foreign journals (1/3 is a review, 2/3 must be original journals). It must use less than 10% textbooks and less than 10% Indonesian journals. The reference must be a publication in the last 10 years.	
<b>8. Presentation (maximum score 10)</b> Written communication is easy to understand, with no redundancy, uses correct, concise and clear Indonesian, and includes references. The oral presentation is on time (not exceeding the time provided of 15-20 minutes). The student can explain figures, tables, and graphs well. The student comprehends the presentation materials well that he/she can explain everything clearly, not merely reading the presentation.	
<b>9. How the student answers questions (maximum score 10)</b> The student answers the questions clearly, briefly, and firmly and demonstrates mastery of the presented materials. The student understands the questions and knows how to respond correctly.
